<u>Mortal</u>:

(from 1828 dictionary)

- 1. Subject to death; destined to die.
- 2. Deadly; destructive to life; causing death, or that must cause death;
- 3. Bringing death; terminating life.
- 4. Deadly in malice or purpose; as a mortal foe.
- 5. Exposing to certain death; incurring the penalty of death; condemned
- to be punished with death;
- 6. Human; belonging to man who is mortal

Immortal:

(from 1828 Dictionary)

- 1. Having no principle of alteration or corruption; exempt from death; having life or being that shall never end
- 2. To the King eternal, immortal, invisible, the only wise God, be honor and glory forever. 1 Tim.1.
- 2. Never ending; everlasting; continual.
- 3. Perpetual; having unlimited existence.
- 4. Destined to live in all the ages of this world; imperishable;

Immortality:

(from 1828 Dictionary)

The quality of never ceasing to live or exist; exemption from death and annihilation; life destined to endure without end;
